Gary Barlow To Visit Kenya!



That's right! Legendary Take That and X-Factor judge, Gary Barlow, is to visit Kenya next week to find inspiration for his new collaboration with Sir Andrew Lloyd Webber. The duo will be co-writing a song for the Queen's Diamond Jubilee and to find inspiration for the song, Barlow will be visiting Commonwealth countries including Kenya to find out what the Queen means to ordinary people.

With Kenya's diverse cultural mix of western, Arabic and traditional tribal music, Barlow will be sure to get lots of ideas for his new song. His journey will also be the subject of an hour-long documentary to be shown on BBC One during the Summer.

The song will be performed outside Buckingham Palace on 4 June 2012 at the Diamond Jubilee Concert which has attracted more than one million ticket applications. Other stars that have been signed up to perform at the concert include Dame Shirley Bassey, Jessie J and Ed Sheeran.

#### Beach Management Programme from the Kenya Wildlife Service



Introduced last year, the six month pilot Beach Management Programme by the Kenya Wildlife Service has worked to develop the stretch of beaches between Mombasa and Mtwapa Creek on the north coast. Frequent patrols have been initiated, daily beach clean-ups and the reorganization of beach vendors has meant that the beaches are now much more visitor friendly. Hotels along the stretch of coast have been able to put out sun loungers with full waiter service for guests staying at some of the hotels.

You can see from this picture, the programme has worked incredibly well

for both hotel guests and the local community having helped youth employment in the area as well. Sh160 million (£1.2 million) has been invested in the project and following the overwhelming success, it is expected to be extended further along the coast.

#### **Singing Wells Project**



Launched in March 2011, the Singing Wells Project is a collaboration between a small record label in London, Abubilla Music and Nairobi's Ketebul Music. It's an initiative which aims to record, celebrate and share the traditional music of Kenya. The inspiration comes from the Samburu tribes people who dig deep wells in the riverbed to collect their water. These wells are often called 'singing wells' as the tribes people often sing to keep a rhythm while lowering and lifting their buckets.

The Singing Wells team will be travelling throughout Kenya and East Africa

to discover more about the music and dance of traditional music groups. Their next trip in 2012 will be in March to the Great Rift Valley, tracing the heritage of the Kalenjin – an ethnic group that has produced many of Kenya's top athletes.
